

My True Christmas Story By Pastor C. S. Cooley

Christmas is one of the most joyous times of the year when Jesus our Savior is the center. The exact date of his birth has been debated for centuries, but the fact that he was born cannot be denied. With that in mind I want to take you back to one of my early life experiences during Christmas of 1952.

I was about 3 years old when my mother was taken away to a hospital. I thought she would be returning soon, but I did not see her again for 6 years. That Christmas began as a great disappointment, but hope in the impossible is high at Christmas: hope that Santa Claus would bring her back. In time I began to realize that Santa was not God and could not grant miracles. However, my grandfather was a preacher and he had talked so much about Jesus that I began to hope that He would help me.

As a boy I could not understand why I had to be without my mother. Then, as I learned the story of baby Jesus, who was born in a stable, I realized that at least I had a real home and my brother and sisters and father to comfort me. I remember when my baby sister was born and how lovingly my mother cared for her in our home. In contrast, Jesus was born with no doctor. He only had his mother and father and the manger animals to comfort him. That had to be far worse than what I was experiencing.

It has been over 51 years since I learned about the baby Jesus, and during that passing of time I have committed my life to Him. He allowed me to enter into a covenant with him in 1978 that has lasted until the present. He has taught me that from the simplest of beginnings can come the greatest of miracles.

You might ask, what miracle? Well. He allowed me to care for my mother until her death in 1995. During the 20 years my mother lived with me, God revealed to her how important she was in his plan for the world. She said, "I know that I am good for something, because I have produced a Preacher for a son". So whether you are born in a hospital, a house, or a manger, God has a plan for your life. This Christmas, I pray that you have discovered Baby Jesus, not as Santa Claus, but as your Savior, the greatest gift ever given.

to coming in on Saturday, to come in out of the cold, especially for the homeless, and the food is fabulous!" Mara, another visitor, said, "The Thanksgiving Dinner was great! It's my first time here. Loved the music! It was very uplifting. It felt good to be here, safe and happy."

This ministry started quite a few years ago, when Pat was on the Board of Directors at the Springfield Rescue Mission. They first worked with Operation Sonshine, which goes out to the streets, riverfront, Court Square, and bus station with lunch.

After several years, they their began own ministry, preparing the food in their home. They did that for 2 or 3 years, until they connected with Scott Lively and Pastor Cooley and were offered the use of the Coffee House. They gladly moved their operation indoors and continued serving. It was good to be in out of the cold! Their first Saturday at Holy Grounds was December 15, in 2012, when they had 20 people for a Christmas Dinner.

Pat has been a Christian for 32 years and has a heart for hurting people. This is his way of serving the Lord.
