A Tribute to Black History by Roberta D'Amico

The name Frederick Douglass is being talked about much these days. Some citizens are even using it to identify their political position, with good reason. Frederick Douglass was a man of conscience, a great patriot, orator, writer, and speaker of the 1800's, beginning even while still a slave.

Born approximately 1818 in Maryland, at age 8 he started to learn to read, until his teacher was forbidden to continue. It was believed that a man who could read was no longer fit to be a slave. However, he continued to teach himself. Soon he started a Sunday School to teach others. As he grew up, he was abused so badly that he was nearly broken, but he recovered and went on to escape.

He married and raised a family, and began speaking at anti-slavery rallies, becoming a powerful tool for abolition, and gained a reputation as a great writer and orator. Many people said since he was born a slave, he couldn't have possibly accomplished all these things, so when he was in his 20's, he

wrote his own autobiography.

"Once you learn to read," Douglass said, "you will be free forever. The more I read, the more I was led to abhor and detest my enslavers."

Douglass was a true patriot, and believed in right and wrong. He knew how to talk to his people, his race, but also to white people, and our country's leaders. He fostered better relationships between races. He believed in our system of government, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights, but he wanted to make them a reality.

"If only America applied their own principles, the same ones as Frederick Douglass believed in," Pastor Cooley says, "we would be a more just country – a better place for all."

"If I told you that over 55,000,000 American babies had intentionally been killed by their parents since its legalization in 1973, would that make you cry?" says Joanne. "I weep for the lost children of our country! Abortion truly is the ultimate form of bullying! And yet, that aspect is totally ignored."

What can you say when people ask why you are pro-life? The following are my reasons:

mother? Punishing the innocent is not Justice! Abortion is the true crime here!

5.) God's Word tells us to value and choose life. Deuteronomy 30:19 says "...I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing. Therefore, choose life, that you and your offspring may live."
