The story of how I came to the Holy Grounds Coffee House starts with my coming to know Christ Jesus/Yeshua. In 2013, I just closed my business of four years. Not really having a new purpose

for my life, I found myself doing a lot of internet surfing, and decided to start researching prophecies. Intrigued by Nostradamus and other so-called prophets that were well known, I kept searching. Being led by the Holy Spirit, I came across a phrase that I had never heard, "Fall Feasts of the Lord." This soon led me to a YouTube

channel called "A Rood Awakening" and I began to watch Michael Rood's videos about the Hebrew Roots of the Bible and I just couldn't get enough. He explained things to me that I always had questions about. He gave evidence, scriptures, and explanations that I couldn't deny and I found myself on my knees begging GOD to forgive me. The flood gates opened; tears and regret came pouring out. I gave my life to the LORD that day and my world would never be the same.
