I had a Christian Godmother who brought me to church when I was 9 years old. At church they gave an invitation to surrender my life to the Lord, and God saved me. I enjoyed the church; it was a lively Spirit-filled church where I learned a lot of things

from the Bible. But, I also was told some things were in the Bible that weren't there, such as "you can do whatever you want and God will forgive you!" As a child I often talked with God, but now I know what things are true because I have seen them myself, and I know that God is with me, guiding me.

Later, I heard a word from God, through a friend. He told me that I needed to stop doing what I was doing or I would die. Soon after I got into a car accident and they said I died briefly and had to be resuscitated. After rehab, I made a promise to quit drinking. That's when I started learning that God was in my life, revealing things to me. I avoided a car accident when God told me to slow down, and I did, just before I had a flat tire! God also sent someone to help me learn about God. Then I started bringing my children to church.

When I moved to Springfield, the Holy Spirit began revealing the meaning of the Bible to me. Sometimes, when things got bad, I would drink again. Finally, I heard a preacher say, "when you do that, it's like turning back to your own vomit!" A lady in my church told me to learn to call on Jesus' Name instead of drink. After that other things started falling away.

Here in Springfield, my life became more about Jesus. I met a friend at church who told me about the Coffee House, and I volunteered to help out at Family Day, where I met Anne Lively. She invited me to the morning Bible Study. I loved it so much that I walked blocks to get here. By the next year, 2013, I was working here!

Once in a while I get discouraged and want to leave, but God sent me a message to confirm that I was in the right place. I kept hearing the same message: come to the Coffee House! I learned a lot of good things here, such as it's all about God, not all about me!

Through the Bible I learn about myself and that I'm here to help others through Christ being in me. As we help one another, we grow strong. Our previous weaknesses can become our strengths.

Saturday, December 14, we had a wonderful Birthday Party for Jesus! United Temple decorated with a tree and was filled with excited children and parents. They enjoyed the festivities, music, the Christmas story, gifts, food, and of course, with Pastor Cooley leading, the singing of Happy Birthday to Jesus!
