My grandson, Khaleb as a 4-year-old, had a favorite pastime, which was to put his feet in the empty shoes of his father. Once he put his little feet into his father's shoes, he was no longer Khaleb. He would say to me with joy filled excitement, "Look Granny, I'm Dad!" The transformation began with giggles as Khaleb shared the body language of his Dad, the language that Dad uses, and his mannerisms. Khaleb mimicked his Dad as much his child body and the oversized shoes would allow. The transformed Khaleb was quite pleased with himself and his command of doing and saying all the Dad things. Anyone who has seen or knows Dad recognizes the habits of Khaleb's Dad when Khaleb is walking in his father's shoes.

When imitating Dad has repeated several cycles, I call Khaleb "Kwesi" (his dad's name), and Khaleb breaks up into infectious laughter knowing that he has done things just like Dad while wearing Dad's shoes. Khaleb's successful imitation of his father is only confirmed when I call him "Kwesi" and not Khaleb. How many of us desire to put on the shoes of our heavenly father? Have we even considered it? Is it our delight to be called by His Name?

We, the children of God, sometimes act nothing like Him, talk nothing like Him, or make little effort to do things His only begotten Son showed and told us to do. Our walk does not match our talk. Some of our friends, coworkers, even our neighbors wouldn't even know that our heavenly father has children here on Earth. Why is it this way? Are we afraid to be childlike and do what we see in Scripture? Do we lack the courage to do the things our Messiah did?

Our priceless gift of Salvation comes to us with instructions and promises. Be imitators of God as beloved children and walk in love [Eph 5:1-2]. Walking in love is a work of faith, a demonstration and outward display of our obedience to our heavenly Father. Ephesian 6 instructs us to "stand," not barefoot, but with feet shod with the Good News (obedience of Christ and God's promise fulfilled of our Redemption and Salvation). Let's be like Khaleb and put on Our Father's shoes, realizing that they may not fit us at the moment, but we can glorify Him with our efforts to imitate Him, a Father's Day gift to Our Heavenly Father.
