Mr. Fikiri Amisi, who came 4 years ago from the Democratic Republic of Congo, is a pastor at Calvary's Love Church, under Pastor Juan Feliciano. The Congo was involved in civil war, and Amisi went to Zimbabwe, where he learned English. After coming to America as a refugee, he found Calvary's Love Church, where he felt God saying, "This is the place for you!" Being hungry for God, he is now a pastor at Calvary's Love Church, in addition to attending Westfield State University. Also, he sponsors 4 Bible Institutes in 4 other African countries!
